

## **Information on data processing of personal data in the event of video surveillance pursuant to Art. 12, 13, 21 DSGVO**

We take the protection of your personal data very seriously. We process your data in accordance with the provisions of the EU General Data Protection Regulation (DSGVO) and the Data Protection Adaptation and Implementation Act (BDSG). In the following, we inform you pursuant to Art. 12 et seq. DSGVO about the processing of your data.

### **Who is responsible for data processing? (Art. 13 para. 1 a, b DSGVO)**

### **For what purposes and on what legal basis do we process your personal data? (Art. 13 para. 1 c, d DSGVO and § 4 BDSG)**

The collection and processing of personal data during video surveillance is generally permissible in accordance with § 4 para. 1 nos. 2 and 3 BDSG for the exercise of domiciliary rights and for the protection of legitimate interests for specifically defined purposes, provided that it is necessary and there are no indications that interests worthy of protection of the persons concerned prevail. Furthermore, a concluded company agreement is the legal basis for the processing of employees' personal data. Furthermore, the processing of personal data is lawful pursuant to Art. 6 (1) (f) DSGVO, provided that it is necessary to safeguard the legitimate interests of the controller and provided that the interests or fundamental rights and freedoms of the data subject are not overridden. The installation of a video surveillance system is necessary in order to maintain the domiciliary rights of WMT Wieland Metalltechnologie GmbH in the publicly accessible buildings, businesses and security-relevant areas. On the other hand, we have an interest in ensuring that the company's property and company secrets are protected and, by installing the video system, we protect the company and its employees from criminal offences (e.g. sabotage or interference by unauthorised persons). With regard to the interests of third parties that are worthy of protection, the interest of the responsible body can be considered higher can be classified as higher in view of the risk situation. This is supported in particular by the fact that filmed persons are made sufficiently aware of the video surveillance by means of suitable marking before entering the video-monitored areas, that the video data are not evaluated regularly but only on an ad hoc basis in the case of burglaries, thefts, damage to property or suspicion of a criminal offence, and that the data are only stored for a very limited period of time. Furthermore, the data is only processed for other purposes if this is necessary to avert a danger as well as to prosecute criminal offences. Furthermore, a biometric evaluation of the video data, e.g. by facial recognition, does not take place.

### **What personal data do we store and use? (§ 4 para. 1 BDSG)**

We only store and use the personal data that is required to achieve the above-mentioned purposes. Processing only takes place if there are no indications that your interests worthy of protection are overridden.

### **Who receives your personal data? (Art. 13 para. 1 e, f DSGVO)**

As a matter of principle, we do not pass on personal data to third parties unless you have given your consent or there is a legal basis for doing so (e.g. for criminal prosecution). Processing takes place on servers located at WMT Wieland Metalltechnologie GmbH.

## **How long will the data be stored? (Art. 13 para. 2 a DSGVO)**

In principle, we only store your data for as long as is necessary to achieve the purpose, i.e. we usually delete our video recordings within 5 days if there is no suspicion of a criminal offence or your interest worthy of protection opposes further storage. We weigh up the type of surveillance and the storage period individually for each video camera, so that we can also set shorter or longer storage periods. Upon request, we can provide you with information on the individual storage periods. Something else only applies if we are forced to store the recordings for a longer period due to legal obligations.

## **What rights and obligations do you have? (Art. 13 para. 2 b, c, d, e DSGVO)**

- According to Art. 15 DSGVO, you have the right to information. This means that you can request confirmation from us as to whether personal data relating to you is being processed by us.
- According to Art. 16 of the GDPR, you have the right to rectification. This means that you can demand that we correct any inaccurate personal data relating to you.
- According to Art. 17 of the GDPR, you have the right to erasure ("right to be forgotten"). This means that you can demand that we delete personal data relating to you without delay - unless we cannot delete your data because, for example, we have to comply with statutory retention obligations.
- According to Art. 18 DSGVO, you have the right to restriction of processing. This means that we are practically no longer allowed to process your personal data - apart from storing it.
- According to Art. 20 of the GDPR, you have the right to data portability. This means that you have the right to receive the personal data concerning you that you have provided to us in a structured, common and machine-readable format and to transfer this data to another controller.
- Pursuant to Art. 7 (3) of the GDPR, you have the right to revoke your consent for the future at any time.
- According to Art. 13 DSGVO, you have the right to lodge a complaint with the competent supervisory authority. There is no automated decision-making or profiling pursuant to Art. 22 (1) and (4) DSGVO.
- According to Art. 13 DSGVO you have the right to complain to the competent supervisory authority.

There is no automated decision-making or profiling pursuant to Art. 22 (1) and (4) DSGVO.
